




Getting into the Case: Cover Clues!

Before getting into any actual reading, take a look at the cover of VI SPY: LICENCE TO CHILL and see if there are any important clues about the story ...

- Who do you think the main character might be, judging from the cover?
- What is the main character doing? What does this tell you about her?
- Who else can you see in the cover?
- Can you spot a clue on the mug in one of the characters' left hands?
- What about the shadowy figures in the background, who might they be?
- Can you see any words on the cover that give you clues about the story or the characters?
- Create a thought bubble for each of the three main characters on the cover. Write down what you think they might be thinking and give reasons for what you've written.

Note to teachers: please review or adapt this activity according to the needs of the pupils in your group.

- Read the extract again and draw Vi's family tree. Remember, everyone has a different family and a different family tree. Some of us, like Vi, have divorced parents; some of us think of our grandparents as our parents; some of us have no siblings; some of us have two mums; some of us have no mum. Families come in all shapes and sizes. But what can you *predict* about the story from Vi's family tree?
- Think about your own friends and family. Do you think there are any spies in there? If so, what are their undercover names and missions?
- Create your own Spy Family Tree. Give each of your friends or family members an undercover name. What special skills do they have?

Extra Mission: What is a Spy?

Use the Spy Criteria below to get Reading Spies thinking about what it means to be a spy and what skills it takes!

What is a spy? What does the job really involve? In pairs, discuss the following spy skills. Rate yourself from 1-5 (where 1 is not good and 5 is excellent), for each skill:

- Close observation of people or events
- Finding out other people's, rivals' or organizations' secrets
- Keeping secrets
- Gathering information
- Making inferences
- Connecting the dots
- Remembering important facts and clues
- Being able to spot a baddie!

In the video, Maz says that her Spy Skill would be her brilliant hearing. What would yours be? Come up with your very own Spy Skill - you can write it down, draw it, or act it out. Make sure that you give a reason for choosing your special skill.





Don't forget to add all of your work to your special TOP SECRET Reading Spy File. Make sure that you keep everything safe in preparation for all of your future spy missions.
