England, June 1645	 For how long has the country been at war at this point? Who are the two sides that are fighting in the war? Name two reasons why the two sides are at war. Find and copy a phrase that shows people were unsure who would win. 		HISTORY: The story is set in England during 1645. Research what had happened prior to this that led to the civil war.
1	 What does the word 'whistled' suggest about how the musket ball is moving? Look at page 1. Find and copy two words that show this scene is taking place in a castle-like building. What did people believe was the reason for the survival of Compton Blaize? How long ago had the lion been created? Name two things that Merriweather was learning to do. Why did Will 'drop to the ground like a stone'? Look at page 5. How did Will feel about being shouted at? How does the park differ now compared to what it was like before? Use evidence from the text to support your answer. 	Create a short biography of Sir Thomas Fairfax. Make sure you include information about his early childhood, his adult life and his significant achievements. Using the information from your research, create a persuasive advert to try and recruit more people to the rebel cause.	HISTORY: This chapter mentions that Sir Thomas Fairfax leads the rebels. Who was he? What were the rebels trying to achieve?
2	 Explain why the rebels had come to Compton Blaize. How did Merriweather feel about Lady Ellinor potentially surrendering Compton Blaize to the enemy? Use evidence 		



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	 to explain how you know this. Where is Merriweather's father? How long has he been gone? How did Lady Ellinor feel when she realized what Merriweather was doing? 	Write a letter from the perspective of Merriweather to her father, telling him about what Lady Ellinor is doing.	
3	 Who or what is Merlin? Since the rebel army turned up at our gates again, Cook watches our food supplies like a hawk. What is meant by this phrase? Look at page 19. What does this page suggest about the relationship between Merriweather and Agnes? Use evidence. How did Merriweather feel when she was asking Agnes to apologize to Will on her behalf? What did Merriweather think was the reason for her strained relationship with her father? Look at the end of the chapter. What was Merriweather trying to do when she was 'hastily smoothing down her petticoats' and she 'drew in a breath'? 		
4	 Give one difference and one similarity between Lady Ellinor's garden before and during the war. With their beautiful, tightly whorled petals and thorny 		



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	 stems, they suited Lady Ellinor perfectly. What is Merriweather trying to say about her stepmother? Name three things Lady Ellinor had prevented Merriweather from doing before the war broke out. Who do you think Lady Ellinor may be writing to? Explain why people thought the King was trying to change the country back to a Catholic country. Why had Uncle Diggory lied about the treasure? How do you know that Merriweather's father enjoyed his voyages? What impression do you get of Merriweather's father from this chapter? Use evidence to support your answer. 	Write a letter from the perspective of Lady Ellinor to the person you believe she was writing to during the chapter. What might she say to them? Why would she be writing to them?	HISTORY: This chapter mentions the adventurers Sir Francis Drake and Sir Walter Raleigh. What were they famous for? Where did they travel to? How did their adventures impact society? GEOGRAPHY: Using a world map, plot the voyages that Sir Francis Drake and Sir Walter Raleigh completed. Can you also identify where Merriweather's father ventured to?
5	 Why did Merriweather not let Will join her in her escape plan? How did Merriweather feel about having to cut her hair? Use evidence from the text to support your answer. Find and copy a word that shows the food was stolen. Why was Merriweather apprehensive about finally having an adventure of her own? Give three ways the pigeons had been useful to the Pryce household. What was the original use of the door in the pigeon-house? 	Write what happens next. Focus on an initial setting description of Merriweather's journey through the woods.	HISTORY: How did clothing differ between boys and girls during this time? Did the clothing of wealthy people differ to those of average people? Why?



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6	 How did Merriweather feel when she thought a rebel sharpshooter was close by? How do you know this? Who was it that was following her? How did Merriweather persuade Merlin to forgive her? How did Merriweather know that something was wrong in the village? Give two ways the author shows that the old man is blind. Where did the old man say Merriweather's father was going? What advice had Merriweather's father given her about using the compass? 	Write a newspaper article about the village being plundered from the perspective of a Royalist reporter. How would this differ if written from the perspective of a rebel supporter?	
7	 Give three pieces of evidence of the war that Merriweather sees on her travels. Why do you think Merriweather's bundle grew heavier? How did this village differ to the one she had previously travelled through? What stopped Merriweather from continuing towards the church? How did Merriweather know that the men she saw were 'up to no good'? Were the people who raided the house rebels or Royalists? How do you know? 		HISTORY: Merriweather mentions Moll Cutpurse, the famous thief. Research crime and punishment in this era. What crimes were common? What were the consequences if caught? How does it compare to today or other periods of time?



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8	 Where did the rebel soldier take Merriweather? How did Merriweather know that Samuel Jeames was the same person who had worked at Compton Blaize? Why would Merriweather want to avoid being recognized by Samuel Jeames? So many good men cut down by the forces of our tyrant King. What does the word tyrant suggest about Shine's thoughts on the King? What evidence is there to suggest that Ned likes animals in this chapter? Give two examples. 	Write a letter from Merriweather to her stepmother, explaining what she has done and where she is going. You may also want to include some questions that Merriweather may want the answers to. Use this chapter to help you.	
9	 Why was Ned's face 'alive with excitement' when he woke Merriweather up? How did Merriweather know that the men did not know of Captain Flint's imminent arrival? Give three differences between the captain and the other men he arrived with. How long ago did the general move on from Oxford? Many characters have mentioned the word 'intelligence'. What do they mean by this? How can you tell that Captain Flint is of high rank? How do the other rebels act around him? 		HISTORY: This chapter is set on 11 June 1645. Create a timeline of the key events of the civil war up until this point.



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10	 Explain how Ned ended up with Corporal Shine and his rebel soldiers. Why did Ned think that Merriweather was from a wealthy family? Where did Merriweather's inspiration for her bird's name come from? What is meant by the phrase 'swear allegiance'? What do you think Captain Flint would have done if Merriweather had told him the truth? Use evidence to support your answer. Look at page 96. What do you think Captain Flint's opinion of Shine is? Use evidence from the text to support your answer. 	Write a letter as Ned to his parents, explaining what has happened on his journey and why he is taking longer than expected.	HISTORY: Ned mentions that he thinks Merriweather is 'proper fancy'. How was life different for rich and poor people during this time? GEOGRAPHY: Look at a map of Britain from the time the book is set. Can you plot where Merriweather has travelled so far? Can you find Leicester and plan a route to get there? Can you find where Ned says he lived?
11	 How did Merriweather know that it was approximately noon? Suggest how the men felt about Flint telling them they would be taking a break. Use evidence to support your answer. Who were the men referring to when they spoke about the 'preacher'? What do you think the 'worn, leather-bound book' was? Heaving a sigh, Merriweather trudged after him. What does this suggest about how she felt? Why do you think she felt this way? 		



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12	 How did Merriweather feel when Ned lifted her from the horse? How do you know? Look at page 108. How does the author show that the men are friends with each other? Find and copy evidence. Look at page 111 and 112. Has this changed your impression of Captain Flint? Explain why using evidence from the text. Explain why Flint called his dog Touchstone. Flint says that his dog 'can sniff out the bad in a man'. Does Touchstone think Merriweather is bad? How do you know? Do you agree with his judgement? Why? Ned says that Shine has a 'honey-coated tongue'. What does he mean by this? 	Write a set of instructions on how to create a fire that Merriweather could follow. Remember to be precise when writing each step.	
13	 Look at page 120. How do you know that Touchstone does not like Shine? What is Flint expecting the men to do whilst he is gone? How did Shine manage to persuade the other men to raid the farmhouse they had passed? Look at page 123. Find and copy a phrase that shows Ned was unsure about whether he should go with the men to raid the farmhouse. Why would Merriweather feel 'hope-filled' when she thought nobody would answer the door? 	Write the next chapter of the story. What do you think Jeames is going to do? What do you think Merriweather will do? Will she be able to prevent the men from hurting or stealing from the family? Explain why Merriweather being friends with Merlin made the situation worse. What were the possible consequences if Merriweather could not convince General Fairfax? 	Write a speech for Merriweather for when she has to persuade General Fairfax to believe her.

What do you think the 'cry of a wild animal' was? Explain why you think this using evidence from the text. What did the different-coloured strips of cloth inside Shine's coat represent? She was lucky to have such a true and loyal friend. What is meant by the word loyal? How did Ned manage to find Merriweather? Find and copy a piece of evidence that shows Ned was embarrassed about not being able to read the letter. 	Write the next chapter. What do you think will happen next now that Shine has found Ned too? Write the letter that Captain Flint gave Ned to take with him to General Fairfax. What do you think he would say to the general? Think about the level of formality he would use.	PSHE: Merriweather says that Merlin has been a true and loyal friend. What qualities would you expect to find in a good friend? Based on your list, would you say that Ned is a good friend?

Research his life and significant achievements. What impact did he have?
