7	 What might Sufia's problem with Tamarind be? Is it right for Sufia to be so unkind? What do you think will be inside the hut? 	Write a letter from Tamarind to her father.	
8	 Why doesn't anyone go into the hut now? How did the monkey know the floorboard was loose? Who keeps the hut in good condition, if no one is allowed in? 	Write a setting description of the hut.	Create a Top Trumps set of animals which live in India.

If you had to give something special to a friend, what would you choose? Why? 	Rewrite the meeting from the point of view of Ishta. 20	 Will Tamarind be allowed to keep the ring? Should Tamarind tell someone about Sufia? Would you go after Sufia? 	Write a prediction – what will happen to Sufia?	Create a survival backpack – what would you take if you were spending a night in the wilderness?
21	 Why is it more dangerous to go out in the storm? Can Sufia see Ishta? 	Write a poem based on the storm the girls have been caught in.	Write a piece of music (using technology or physical instruments)

25	 What is the relevance of the lightning hitting the tree? Why is Nani now able to look at photos? Ishta has gone. Explain why you think this is. 		Bring in a photo of you as a young child. As a class, create a gallery and guess who is who! Create a class photo album using these photos, or other recent pictures.





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26	 Are you glad Tamarind and Sufia are friends? What makes Tamarind sad about the tree? Is she looking forward to her dad and Chloe arriving? The tree has now come out in blossom. What is the symbolism of this? 		Research the Tamarind tree and other jungle plants. Create a botanist's notebook based on your findings.
27	 Discuss the chapter as a class – why do you think it is particularly meaningful? 	Create a comic strip of Tamarind's experience in this chapter.	Create an emotion graph of Tamarind's feelings through the book. What are the main plot points?
28	 How is Arjun feeling? Do you believe in magic? Does magic always involve spells? Does Tamarind think it's a compliment to be like her mother? 		Look at the concept of inheritance – what does this mean? Create a family tree of your own and think about what you might have inherited.
29	 Where did they find the bow and arrows? What has made Tamarind treat Chloe differently? Is Tamarind's father feeling welcome? 	Write a magazine article. It can be about anything you think your classmates will be interested in.	Take photos to go alongside your magazine article. Use <i>Vogue</i> and <i>Tatler</i> pictures as inspiration if you like – just like the ones Chloe would take!
