Name all three Hidden Folk. Why do you think the author chose these names? (You may need to use dictionaries or research the meaning of their names.) 	Write a description of your own garden or a part of the school grounds/local area, taking inspiration from the author's description in the book.	ART • Based on the description in the book, draw or paint a picture of Moss, Burnet and Cumulus. 2	 When has Cumulus had the strange feeling before? List two types of dinosaur Cumulus liked and two Cumulus was not fond of. Why did Cumulus like/dislike them? How do the Hidden Folk feel about how the world changed when Mortals came? Why do they feel this way? Why did Moss create an annual ballad? Why did Cumulus think their cousins could help them? Do you think they will? Explain why Moss was feeling less excited about their adventure than the others. What does Cumulus reciting a rhyme of reassurance for Moss suggest about Cumulus? What does it suggest about Cumulus's relationship with Moss? How did the Mortals feel when the tree fell? How do you know this? 	Create your own ballad. This could be about the last year, like Moss's, or it could be about a particular period of time that stands out to you. Rewrite the tree falling from the Mortal's perspective. Think carefully about the five senses and include these in your description.	HISTORY/SCIENCE • Create a timeline of different eras throughout history, including those referenced in the book, e.g. the Ice Age, Triassic period, Jurassic period, evolution of man.
3	 Before reading the chapter: Suggest why the author has titled the chapter 'Endings and Beginnings'. What do you think is ending? What do you think is beginning? 	Write an explanation about what you would pack in a bag for going on an adventure. What are the important items? What other items (that are not necessities) would you want to take, and why?	GEOGRAPHY • Have a look at differ- ent types of maps for the local area. How are they the same? How are they different? Which ones are more useful and why? Can you create a route from one place to another?





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	 After reading the chapter: How did the Hidden Folk feel when Ro came? Why did they feel this way? Can you find examples from the text to support this? Explain why Moss's mind changed about going on the adventure. Why couldn't Bob stay with the Hidden Folk for all of their journey? Look at the map. Can you spot the route they were taking? 		
4	 Before reading the chapter: What does 'nocturnal predator' mean? Use a dictionary to help you if you need to. Can you suggest what animal may be the 'nocturnal predator'? Based on what you know about predators, do you think its discovering the campsite is going to be a positive or negative thing? Why? After reading the chapter: What did Burnet use to help their navigation? 'Spending the night in a tent is the most exciting thing.' Do you agree with this statement? Explain your opinion. Why couldn't Moss and Cumulus sleep? Look at the map. Can you spot where they've made camp? How did the Hidden Folk feel about being asked if they were goblins? What does this suggest about their opinions of goblins? Would the owl be pleased or displeased if the Hidden Folk decided to stay instead of passing through? Why would they feel this way? 	Create a campsite experience on school grounds – build tents, cook over a campfire, play a soundscape of the countryside at night. Write a description of what it would be like sleeping in the tent at night.	SCIENCE • Investigate food chains. What is a predator? What is prey? Using paper chains, make food chains showing examples of predators and prey in Britain. Research different animals found in British wildlife – which ones are nocturnal? Which ones are diurnal? What do these words mean? OUTDOOR LEARNING/ COOKING • Create a campsite experience on school grounds – build tents, cook over a campfire. What materials could you use to make a good tent? Why would you use these materials? What risks are there with cooking over a campfire? How can you keep yourself safe?





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5	 Before reading the chapter: What is the meaning of 'smooth-talking'? What animal do you think it is referring to? Do you think they should trust this character? After reading the chapter: True or false: the Hidden Folk were unafraid when they met the snake. Find evidence from the text to show why you think it is true or false. Look at page 53. Why has the author written the snake's speech in this way? How do you think you would feel if you were in Burnet's position when Burnet found out about Cumulus's hands? Do you think Burnet was right to feel that way? Why? On page 61, Cumulus and Burnet have opposing views on whether they would want to be invisible. Who do you agree with? Why? 	Write an explanation about what you would do if you woke up and found that you were invisible for the day. Make sure to include your feelings as well as explaining what you would do and why.	SCIENCE • Research different ways in which animals adapt to the changing climate during the seasons, e.g. which animals hibernate? Why do they hiber- nate? Which birds migrate and why? Discuss and research changes that happen between seasons, e.g. life cycles of flowers, evergreen/decidu- ous trees.
6	 How did Burnet know which way was north? Find and copy words or phrases that show the Hidden Folk were nervous about meeting the deer. Explain how the Hidden Folk showed their respect to the deer when they first arrived. What are the two conditions the Hidden Folk must follow in order for the deer to carry them? Would you have agreed to the conditions the deer set? Explain why/ why not. 	Write a persuasive argument about why the deer should take the Hidden Folk on their journey.	SCIENCE • Research and write a non-chronological report about wolves. Do they still exist in the UK? If not, why? Include this in your report.





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7	 Before reading the chapter: Look at the map. The summary of the chapter is 'A great distance is travelled.' How far do you think they will travel? Can you find a place on the map that you think they will get to? After reading the chapter: What were the 'pair of small black tubes' the Mortal used to look at the deer? Explain why Fleet and Cumulus think Mortals are lonely. On page 78, find and copy a word that shows this part of their journey is dangerous. What was the danger that the deer referred to at the beginning of the chapter? Where do you think Burnet is? Do you think the others will find Burnet? 		COMPUTING • Design a program to navigate a programmable robot (e.g. Beebot) across a 'road', avoiding obstacles.
8	 What did Fleet, Moss and Cumulus think had happened to Burnet? Explain the real reason why Burnet arrived later than the others. Do you think the deer were right to stop the Hidden Folk travelling any further with them for breaking their vow? Explain your reasoning. What happened to Cloudberry? Predict what will happen next. Do you think the cousins are at home or not? Why? Summarise what happened in the first part of the book. What is the smallest number of words you can do it in? 	Write a discussion about whether Burnet made the right decision to break the vow. Do you think the deer should have let the Hidden Folk continue on their journey with them? Compare Sorrel's feelings when the Hidden Folk first knocked on the door to Sorrel's feelings at the end of the chapter. How are they the same? How are they different? What kind of animal is Hetty? How does Sorrel's home differ from Moss, Cumulus and Burnet's home? 	Rewrite the chapter from the perspective of Sorrel. What would Sorrel be thinking and feeling?	ART • Create a painting of the Folly Brook based on the description.

Create a persuasive advert for one of Sorrel's contraptions, or the contraption you designed. What makes it so unique? Why is it useful? SCIENCE • Learn about the phases of the moon and the changes to length of day and night throughout the seasons. MUSIC • Use a range of instruments to create a piece of music representing the sounds of the Folly Brook.
12	 Before reading the chapter: What do you think the 'exciting machine' is going to be? How will the machine help the Hidden Folk? Look at the map.
